### FROM THE PASTOR

ON THIS TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, our Scriptures deal with the storms of life that we all encounter, many time over. God speaks to Job out of the storm (Job 38:1), and in the Gospel, a sudden storm sweeps down on the Sea of Galilee as Jesus and the disciples are crossing the lake in a boat (Mark 4:35-41). The Sea of Galilee is a freshwater lake 705 feet below sea level. Nazareth is 1,138 feet above sea level. In the short 30km journey from Nazareth to the Sea of Galilee, there is a significant rise in temperature due to the difference in elevation as you go down to the Sea of Galilee. As temperatures build up around the Sea of Galilee during the day, the hot air rises and is replaced by cooler air coming down from the surrounding hills, and when these different air masses meet, there are sudden and violent storms. Jesus and His disciples got caught up in one of these sudden, violent storms in the Gospel today. Jesus was asleep at the back of the boat. The waves were breaking over the side into boat and the disciples started to panic. They woke up Jesus and practically rebuked Him: "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus rebuked the storm, like the way that He rebuked the demon in the possessed man in the synagogue in Capernaum earlier (Mark 1:25). The storm abated and Jesus asked two questions of His terrified disciples: "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" Clearly when storms come, Jesus expects us not to fear and remain strong in faith. Folks, no one is exempt from problems and challenges in life - everyone experiences storms of some kind in their lives, not just wind and rainstorms, but personal storms when it seems as if the boat of our lives is being swamped. When the disciples in the boat experienced the storm, they went to Jesus. And you know what? That is the best thing and what we should do when we experience storms of any kind in our lives. Amazing how when we need God and Jesus the most, is when we least turn to them. Sometimes people stop talking to God when they experience storms in their lives. That is the worst possible thing to do during a storm. The best way to get through any personal storm is with Jesus. That is how the disciples in the Gospel made it through the storm, with Jesus. Abandoning God during a storm only makes matters worse. Let's look back a bit to the latter part of the 20th Century - specifically to October 22, 1978, when then-Pope John Paul II, the newly-elected Vicar of Christ on Earth, looked out upon the throng gathered in Saint Peter's Square for his inaugural Mass, and urged them: "Be not afraid." These words would become a familiar refrain in Pope John Paul II's papacy, but in reality, they had long defined his life, and would so until his death in 2005. Pope Saint John Paul II was a man rooted in faith, which helped him greatly face the stormy seas of life. When he defied the Nazis as part of the Polish cultural resistance, when he spoke tirelessly against the evils of Communism, when he forgave his would-be assassin, and when he spent his final years succumbing to illness, his courage never faltered. For the nearly three decades he led the Catholic Church, Pope Saint John Paul II's bold proclamation of the faith loomed larger than life, a vibrant witness in a world battered by a century of global wars and genocides. His joy and courage never wavered because he was not their source. Christ was. In his first homily as Pope, he described the cultural despair of a post-Christian world, and pointed to the cure:

"So often today, man does not know what is within him, in the depths of his mind and heart. So often he is uncertain about the meaning of his life on this earth. He is assailed by doubt, a doubt which turns into despair. We ask you therefore, we beg you with humility and trust, let Christ speak to man. He alone has words of life, yes, of eternal life."

Several years later, in 1999, while speaking to a crowd of young people, encouraging them not to fear, not to fall prey to the way of the world, but to instead follow the way of Christ, Pope John Paul II said:

"Do not be satisfied with mediocrity... Do not be afraid to be holy! Have the courage and humility to present yourselves to the world determined to be holy, since full, true freedom is born from holiness. This aspiration will help you discover genuine love, untainted by selfish and alienating permissiveness."

Folks, we live in good times, we live in troubled times. The pendulum swings – wildly at times! The times we live in are not without precedent. Plagues, wars, injustices, poverty, hedonism, and deceit on a wholesale level are not unique to our time. How we respond to these "stormy sea" events and other challenges define our depth of faith. Might I suggest that in those "stormy sea" days we all encounter, that we come to Church and pray to the Lord, and also pray at home:

Dear Lord, in this life there will be storms that will cause my world to shake. Storms that make me feel like I am alone, I am sinking. Teach me to trust in You so that when the unexpected storms of life come, I will expect peace in the midst of those storms, knowing that You are near, that You hear my cries and my pleas for help, and that You are with me and for me. Lord, bring peace and calm to the storms I am facing or may face in the future. Remind me all that You are and that You control the waters. I pray this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

# John the Baptist: Forerunner of Christ

Solemnity of Saint John the Baptist: June 24 by Kevin Tierney

When Catholics typically celebrate the Saints in the liturgy, we often think of those like the Apostles, the Blessed Virgin, doctors of the Church, etc. While all of these are important saints, the saint we celebrate today is often not thought of as in their company. Yet St. John the Baptist probably rivals only Jesus and the Blessed Mother in importance to Christians. When we invoke the names of the saints in the *Confiteor* (in the Extraordinary Form), only Mary is given a higher honor than that of John the Baptizer. In various Eastern liturgies, he is frequently referred to as "the Great Forerunner" and is held in the highest of esteem.

Why have Catholics traditionally held John the Baptist in such high esteem? A lot of modern commentary focuses on two aspects of John's life: The Visitation, and his beheading. (Of interest is that the Extraordinary Form and Eastern Rites also commemorate his beheading.) This is done for understandable reasons. In today's culture of death, it is nice to be reminded that even the unborn were sanctified by Christ's presence, and how from the moment of his conception John was destined for greatness. Likewise, in a society experiencing the redefinition of marriage, it is comforting to remember that John spoke against a similar evil (in condemning a marriage contrary to God's law) and was martyred for it.

Important as these things are, I think it would be a mistake to confine John to the setting of the modern culture wars. Jesus called him the greatest prophet, and viewed it essential that he be baptized by John. I want this to sink in your head before we continue. The Almighty and Omnipotent God viewed it essential that he be seen as a follower and spiritual successor of a man. What makes John so important?

To understand this, we need to understand the nature of a prophet. Far too often, the office of the prophet is portrayed in contemporary eyes as that of a glorified fortune teller. To prophesy is to speak only of future events, and normally in a very obscure fashion. This is quite simply not the biblical concept of a prophet. A prophet existed to announce to the people that they had to recapture their original calling through repentance. Once they had done this, they could then live in security for the future. If they did not, then their continuing decline would reach a critical point. In short, they used the past to change the present so the future would be better.

A secondary reason for a prophet's existence was that of building up. Through the faithful execution of their office, they help trigger a spiritual renewal within those they minister to. While the reigns of Hezekiah and Josiah might have been viewed as the low points of Judah's military power, they were viewed as a high point of Israel's relationship with God, due to the actions of Isaiah and Jeremiah.

It is only through this perspective can John the Baptist's greatness be understood. In the Canticle of Zechariah, his father announces to Israel that his son will:

- 1.) Give salvation unto the people. (Luke 1:77)
- 2.) Bring them God's mercy upon the people (1:78)
- 3.) Enlighten those who sit in darkness (1:79)
- 4.) Direct the path of Israel in God's peace (1:79)

In doing these things, it is not enough to say that John the Baptist is fulfilling his ministry. In doing these things, *he is fulfilling the ministry of Israel*. Israel was chosen by God (Deuteronomy 14:2) to be a holy priesthood among the nations (Exodus 19:6), whose purpose was to reveal God to the Gentiles. John arrives on the scene exhorting Israel that the purpose of their existence is finally at hand. For thousands of years they were called to live a life of witness to a coming messiah. Now that Messiah was imminent, so they had to start taking things seriously. The moment of salvation every generation since Adam had hoped for was finally at hand. Even objects of scorn such as the Pharisees and Sadducees recognized that something important was about to happen, as they too went and saw John. (Matthew 3:6-7)

In addition to announcing the imminent arrival of the Messiah, John calls upon not just Israel, *but the entire world* to enter a stage of spiritual renewal. He rebukes the Pharisees and Sadducees by noting their mind was in the right place, but their heart wasn't. (Matthew 3:7-10) Even pagans and traitors (Roman soldiers and

tax farmers) recognized his greatness, and came to him seeking advice on how to transform their lives. John doesn't turn them away, as Israel's tradition had long welcomed the foreigner, especially when he turned towards God. (Isaiah 42:6)

Another way he fulfilled the prophetic office was by "making straight the path for the Lord." While this can be viewed as him being the vanguard of Christ, I think a deeper interpretation is also likely. John shows the nations the clear path to God. He commands people to repent, do penance, and be baptized. After this, they are to prepare themselves and others for the one who comes after Him, who baptizes with the Spirit. In today's world there are many who speak of finding ways to God. Even in our Church, we have those who are of reputed authority who offer a way to God, but it is not a clear and straight path. While never doing so uncharitably, John clearly points the way to God for others to follow.

This is why John the Baptist is held in such high regard: He was the prototype of all Christians. He announced Christ to the world, he did so in a manner the people could understand, and he encouraged a real spiritual renewal take place as a result of these two points. As we continue to look for models to live our lives after, let us today look upon the example of the Holy Forerunner.


